
Clubs and Clinics




L4L

GCSE

Some students will be entered for Further Maths GCSE in addition to their other choices.

In addition to their examined curriculum, students will have four lessons of Core PE and one lesson of L4L (including RS) per fortnight.

A-Level

In Years 12 and 13, the majority of our students the six core subjects of English Language, English will take three A Levels, chosen from the broad range of subjects on offer.

> Some students will take four A Levels and in exceptional cases, Further Mathematicians may take five A Levels.

We aim to deliver a range of A Levels to give students the opportunity to pursue a wide range of career aspirations.

The majority of our A Level subjects are taught over 10 hours per fortnight in Year 12 and 8 hours per fortnight in Year 13, however, some smaller classes that have lower student to teacher ratios will have 8 hours per fortnight in each year.



GCSE Mathematics - AQA

- GCSE with grades 9 to 1
- All exams sat in summer 2027
- Three 1 hour 30 minute papers
- One paper will be without a calculator
- All students entered for Higher Level



GCSE Mathematics

- Students split into two bands depending on their option choices
- Band M is split into 4 classes two set 1 and two set 2
- Band N is split into 3 classes one set 1 and two set 2
- All sets do Higher GCSE (AQA 8300)
- Sets M1a, M1b, and N1 also have the chance to study for another maths qualification called AQA Level 2
 Certificate in Further Maths



Further Maths

- Grades 5 to 9
- Two 1 hour 45 minutes papers
- Paper 1 is without a calculator





Kit and Equipment

We provide: Tent, trangia cooking stove, gas, maps, compass, group first aid kit

You provide:

50 - 65 Litre Rucksack - ideally should have an adjustable back and must have a waist belt - try on to check it fits. You can buy rucksacks specifically built for slim/smaller young people.

Waterproof coat and trousers - taped seams and a hood Sleeping bag - 2 season (0 - 5 degrees) or 3 season (- 5 degrees) Roll mat - foam or self inflating (not a yoga mat!)

Walking boots - need to have good strong soles and ankle support - try them before buying



Encourage your daughter to discuss a range of strategies to tackle a situation to see what works best




