Paper 3 - Geographical Skills

There are 2 parts to this paper:

<u>Section A</u> - Issue Evaluation. For this part of the paper, students will receive a 'pre-release' document 12 weeks before the exam (end of March). They will need to study this and then answer questions on it in the exam)

<u>Section B</u> - Field work. Students will answer questions on fieldwork completed in Dorset in October 2026 and will need to apply their understanding to 'unseen' fieldwork questions.
